HALF WAY

Round Nine - half way mark of the home and away season - and time for a mid-term reflection to reflect on events thus far. All teams have played each other, looked each other in the eye and will no doubt come again with a new battle plan if unsuccessful.

The first nine rounds are used to size up your opponent; the second nine are to land some telling punches when preparing for the knockout blows in September. No longer does that cheeky goal-sneak or the recruit from the country get under your guard. Every player is accounted for.

The Amateur footballer looks at each individual section in some detail, but overall, it is fair to say that 2009 is proving to be as competitive and enthralling as ever. One of the major strengths of the VAFA is the depth of our clubs in our lower sections. Last week, I watched the D2 game between Williamstown CYMS and Old Westbourne. The game was played in extremely windy and cold conditions, yet the standard of play was extremely high. With these clubs, and Werribee, we are building strength in the western suburbs and it surely won't be long before a team or two from out that way is slugging it out in our premier divisions.

The most competitive of all the Sections is B. The top three teams, St Bernards, Old Melburnians and St Kevins, were all defeated on the weekend closing the gap between relegation and promotion. One week, you're staving off relegation and the next, shooting for the four. There is no time for complacency in this grade.

It is always pleasing to see the clubs who went through the tough times one year, re-organising themselves and having a shot at the finals the following. Two clubs that have rebounded

strongly are Rupertswood (D1) and La Trobe Uni (D4), our only undefeated senior sides. Others looking strong after a fall include Caulfield Grammarians in C, Whitefriars in D1, Bentleigh and St Mary's/Salesian in D3 and La Trobe Uni in D4.

On the other hand, it seems the clubs promoted this year are having a tough time of it with the notable exceptions of Werribee (D1), Williamstown (D2) and St Francis Xavier (D3), all of whom appear headed for the finals, while incremental improvement from Ormond (B) and Eltham (D2) could see them still reach the four.

However the biggest improver thus far has been De La Salle. De La hasn't played in an A Section finals since 1993 and has never really threatened to do so since returning to the main stage in 2006. Last season they finished eighth on the ladder, but have taken huge steps this season to better that. Eight wins, one loss and equal first on the ladder as we turn. De La would have an unblemished record but for a lapse when it surrendered a 7 goal lead.

I am pleased with the space the Age is giving the VAFA on Monday mornings and I was particularly delighted with the spread Paul Daffey did on De La a fortnight ago. The ways to build a powerful VAFA football club are varied, but there is plenty to like about the way De La has gone about its business.

Today's top of the table clash against Xavs has been a long time coming, but this is just one of a number of challenges they will face in the second half of the season on the way to a shot at again claiming the coveted L. A. Adamson Cup.

The front nine is behind us, but that was the easy part, just the warm-up. Now we are homeward bound with Amen Corner still ahead of us. The premierships, the finals and relegation are still mathematically possible for all ten clubs, though it would take a massive upending of the apple cart for that parable about the *first being last and the last first* to come true this year.

In truth, the A Section competition has broken into three groups. Ennio Morricono dubbed them, *il Buono, il Brutto, il Cattivo*, (for those not versed in the native tongue of Gina Lollobrigida, *the Good, the Bad, the Ugly*). Recognising the chameleon-like characteristics of most A Section outfits, we group them according to already displayed levels of competence:

- Old Xavs, De La Salle, SBMT and Uni Blues
- Old Brighton, Old Scotch, Collegians
- Marcellin, Old Essendon and Old Ivanhoe

There can be no argument with that first congregation, nor indeed the last. *Il Brutto* might be a tough mark for the middle band, as each has enjoyed some good days, but those have indeed been mixed with the poor. While the three in the cellar try to find their way back up the stairs, it is for that middle group to make a run that will see them with a September commitment, or at very least, shape the seedings for the post-season.

While the top dogs guard their spots, they can hardly indulge in cartel behaviour. The race for the double chance has begun already, with the top four all rating their chances and keen to knock each other off the perch. We may yet be facing weeks of turmoil at the top, which may open the door slightly for a team to give it a Nicklaus at Augusta '86 style crack.

De La Salle did their chances no harm last week with a stunning victory at Brindisi Street. They have adopted the style of last year's premier as their own and after a cautious beginning that saw them absorbing the intense heat from the home team, they reversed the force field and heaped it back - with interest. **Ben Phibbs** was best afield for SBMT, but he had few friends. **Leigh Harrison, Michael Duggan, Jarrod Moloney, Aaron Shields** and the tough and talented skipper **David Lowe** were perhaps the best of a very sharp De La outfit. This is a very quick team, hard to catch and with leg-speed that enables them to get to every contest and to lay an effective tackle if beaten to the ball. They are armed and extremely dangerous. The same might be said of the

Tigers, who while outdone last week, still have the power to be beat the best that most teams can dish up.

University Blues welcomed the well-travelled **Alistair Neville** to their lineup and while they led at the first break, found themselves in trouble when Old Scotch raced away in the second quarter. Not for the first time this season, the Cards got a little ahead of themselves, and were on the wrong end of a second-half pasting (12 goals to 3) from the Varsity. **Digger Heinz** turned it on, slotting five or the home team, ably backed by **Matt Torney** who kept the dangerous **Lachie Thompson** quiet, and **Pat Smith** and **Michael Lewis** who scored hat-tricks. **Charlie Tallent** was best for Scotch, who disappointed again after setting up a handy lead.

Old Xaverians humiliated Collegians at Toorak Park, finishing the day an even 100 points to the good. **Matt Handley** continued to dominate with his sure hands and straight shooting, while **Josh Agius** cut swathes through the Purple defense and booted five. **Ollie Gidley, Ryan Colbert** and **Mick Darvell** spelt trouble all day for the Lions, who were punished all over the park. **Kivanc Cevik, Jono Dixon** and **Andrew Scott** toiled in vain for the visitors, while Colls' club officials struggled to recall other defeats as big as this one was.

Old Brighton shook off the trauma of the De La Massacre and began their afternoon in fine style against Old Ivanhoe. As the afternoon progressed, however, the Browns came back strongly to send a shudder down the spines of the boys on the balcony. A mere eight points separated the teams at the end with **Damien Hughes** and **Luke Mann** coming up trumps for the Tonners and **Brett Sinclair** kicking four. **Brad Thompson** and **Rex Roberts** were best for the hapless Hoers, who do not lack talent but have forgotten how to win.

AROUND THE GROUNDS

The Makita Match of the Round down at Shark Park attracted a huge crowd, with Beaumaris hosting ladder leaders Caulfield on a windy Saturday afternoon. A shootout was on the cards as both teams played free-flowing, counter attacking football in spite of the weather conditions. Turning back the clock, hard running Caulfield skipper **Simon "Wij" Widjaja** started to dominate the clearances and with no **Mark Ensor** down back for Beaumaris, **Andrew Slevison** started to run wild in the forward line. His six goals were pivotal as the C Section heavyweights were a little too clean for their premiership rivals to run out 43 point victors. **Luke McNicholas** was tireless in the Ruck for the Sharks but with many of his teammates playing unaccountable football, they find themselves on the verge of being tossed out of the Top 4 with a daunting away trip to Ajax.

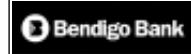

The VFA family lost another icon last week with the passing of AJAX Football Club legend John Brustman.

Mourners at Brustman's well-attended funeral heard how he served as a goal umpire for 621 matches, about 30 seasons' worth.

John's commitment to writing the match reports for The Australian Jewish News lasted much longer. Brustman's first AJAX match report appeared on the back page of the AJN on April 19, 1962. 'AJAX win opener' tells of a 'sound' 26 point win over Brunswick.

Brustman covered the Jackas nearly every week for the next 40 years and his words carried a big stick.

Brustman was the first AJAX identity and one of just four to date to have been honoured by the VFA with a certificate of merit. He was honoured again by the VFA with a lifetime achievement award at the opening home game of this season.

Said AJAX historian Barry Markoff, "*John wasn't just a Saturday follower of the club. He was interested in the club all year around and would often ring during the week out of season just to see how things were shaping up for the following season. He really was Mr AJAX.*"

AJAX won on Saturday, beating Parkdale at Parkdale by 44 points, the club's first ever win at that ground. Mr AJAX would have loved it.

Benny's Rule of the Week

CONTESTING THE CENTRE BOUNCE



The centre bounce or throw up of the football shall be contested by one (1) nominated player from each team. The player contesting the centre bounce shall be positioned in his team's defensive half of the playing surface and with both feet within the 10 metre circle.

The player may only enter the teams attacking half after the football touches the ground, in the act of bouncing, or leaves the Field Umpires hand, in the act of throwing the ball up.

The player shall not be permitted to block an opponents approach to the contest.

No other player may enter the 10 metre circle until the football touches the ground, in the act of bouncing, or leaves the Field Umpires hand, in the act of throwing the ball up.

The players must have both feet inside the 10-metre circle at all times until they contest the bounce or until the Field Umpire calls play-on due to an "offline bounce".

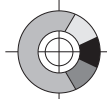
Scorecards please

A good test for Therry Penola this week against the fourth placed Williamstown, it should be a cracking game.

Williamstown won an important encounter at home against Old Westbourne on Saturday. The Western Suburbs neighbours were battling for bragging rights in a match that was vital for both side's finals aspirations. Aided by a strong northerly wind it was the CY's who jumped out of the blocks full of running – slamming on 8 goals to none – to lead by 54 points at the first change. 5 YEARS AGO – 2004

The big game in **C Section** was between second and third placed **Old Camberwell Grammarians** and **Caulfield Grammarians**, possibly to see who would be the main challengers to undefeated **Melbourne High School Old Boys**. It was Caulfield who impressed early with good forward targets in **Will** and **Baxter**, the main feeders being **Widjaja**, **Pearce** and **Sharpe**. It was a handy 2 goal lead for the Fields at quarter time. Camberwell staged an excellent second term with **Mitchell**, **Williams** and **Bayford** setting the example and their 6 goals for the quarter gave them a 3 goal lead. An even third term set up a thrilling last quarter but Caulfield's kicking was ordinary to say the least as they posted 2.8 for the quarter. Camberwell found it difficult to convert but did enough to ensure a draw at siren time; Camberwell 11.6 and Caulfield 10.12. The reserves game was also a thriller with Camberwell winning by 1 point.

The majority of games in **D1 Section** were also close affairs, the closest a 1 point win in the **Salesian** versus **Peninsula Old Boys** match. Salesian desperately needed a win to improve their chances of avoiding relegation and Peninsula needed to stay in touch with the top four. Peninsula were very wasteful in the first quarter with 1.7 and trailed Salesian 2.1. The Pirates continued to miss easy shots in the second quarter but led by 76 points at half time and increased this to 12 points at three quarter time. Just when Salesian seemed destined to remain on 1 win for the season, they surged to the front and held on by a solitary point 10.9 to 9.14. Best players **Hanton**, **Nannes**, **Loughnan** (3), **Oldfield**, **Canavan** (Salesian) and **T Prendergast**, **Claringbold** (3), **Teelow**, **Murray**, **Dunne** (Peninsula).

Old Mentonians went down in a thriller to **Ormond** by only 2 points but were proud to congratulate **Club Captain**, **Andrew Carter**, on joining the Panthers exclusive **200 club**. **Andrew** was a tall, skinny centre half forward with the club's U19's in 1991 however he gradually "filled out" to become a commanding ruckman, holding down the number one role for almost a decade. "Carts" was also a model of consistency.

Ivanhoe Amateur Football Club held its inaugural **Hall of Fame** night and announced the following 10 inductees – **John "Jiggy" Harris**, coached the club to 3 flags in a row and 60 consecutive wins. **Hec**

Rutherford, captained the club under **Jiggy Harris**. **Don Blackwood**, premierships player in 1969 and still actively involved in club affairs (also an excellent Amateur Footballer scribe for a number of years – GR). **Russell Burt**, past champion player and club official. Alan Lee, club official and club umpire since 1988. **Reg Miles**, a member of the 1956 A Section premierships and club committeeman, fundraiser and junior coach. **Ida Marcon**, the club's best known supporter ("Ivanhoe Ida"). **Harry Thomas**, lifelong involvement with the club as player, president and timekeeper. **Billy McWhinnie**, former champion rover and club captain and coach. **John Miles**, dual premierships player in the 50's and served in almost every club position. John is also a former VAFA Executive member and a VAFA Life Member (and a very good card player on interstate trips – GR).

10 YEARS AGO – 1999

A Section scribe, **Jason Frenkel**, reported that **Uni Blues Coach**, **Grant Williams**, had said at the beginning of the season that his A Section team would take some time to get moving. **Jason** also reported that the time had now come as the Blues stormed all over the ladder leaders, Old Melburnians and stormed back into finals contention in the process. At the University Oval the Blues started strongly and **Adam Lennen** (5) and **James Hayter** were very productive forwards for the Blues. Basically sealing the game in the second term with 6 more goals, the Blues never looked like relinquishing their hold on the game and only **Lachlan Boyd** and **Lachlan Bunn** looked comfortable for the Redlegs. The OM's kicking for goal left a lot to be desired but they were outplayed by their refined opposition. Best players – **Sturrock**, **Davis**, **Sheehan**, **Wilson**, **J Hayter** (4), **Versteegen** (Uni Blues) and **L Bunn**, **L Boyd**, **Ross**, **Thompson**, **Campbell**, **Nayna** (Old Melburnians).

In **B Section**, the two ladder leaders, **Collegians** and **MHSOB**, were both defeated in what was proving to be a very even competition. **Old Paradians** and **Beumaris**, with three wins apiece and sitting at the bottom of the table were not out of the race. Against **Collegians**, **Old Trinity** took control of the game early with 7 goals to 1. They outscored **Collegians** again in

the second term to hold a 6 goal lead. Collegians were implored to lift their game and they did initially but Trinity turned up the heat with another 8 goals and romped home 22.9 to 12.10 to stake their claim as genuine contenders. Best players – **Frost** (8), **R Phillips**, **Stevens**, **C Phillips** (4), **Andrews**, **Heighton** (Trinity) and **Elg**, **Jefferson**, **Caldwell**, **Palmer**, **McKenzie** (3), **Unsworth** (Collegians).

AJAX were at the top of the **Blades Club Championship** with 178 points from **Monash Blues** and **Old Xaverians**, both on 169.

20 YEARS AGO – 1989

In wintry conditions, **E Section** flag favourites, **La Trobe Uni**, had no trouble disposing of **Uni High School Old Boys**. The Uni High guys had real trouble scoring only managing their first goal late in the second term while the Trobers had already placed 7.8 on the board. It didn't get any better for the visitors in the second half and La Trobe won 12.13 to 1.1. Best players – **Cousins**, **Benbow**, **Brownlaw**, **Tucci**, **Little**, **Poole** (La Trobe) and **Skinns**, **Kemp**, **Gathercole**, **Morris**, **Lugg**, **Strachan** (UHSOB).

In **F Section**, after and even first quarter, **ANZ Bank** pulled away from **Footscray Institute of Technology** by half time with a 4 goal lead. The Zedders did not relax and ran away with the game in the second half 25.22 to 11.12, an excellent result in the heavy going. Best players – **Schaper** (5), **Nicolosi** (4), **J McDonald**, **Siletz** (6), **Cumming** (ANZ) and **Phillips** (4), **Cliff**, **Breeny**, **Mills**, **Lewis**, **Case** (Footscray)

30 YEARS AGO – 1979

Thornbury faced up to top team **North Brunswick** in **E Section** and took it right up to the leaders in the first half looking at only 1 goal separating the two teams. Playing a great third quarter, **Thornbury** looked capable of an upset and upset it was at the final bell 14.11 to 12.10 and **Thornbury** were now equal fourth. Best players – **Byrne** (3), **G Burrows**, **M Staff**, **Harbour**, **Dellava**, **Ware** (Thornbury) and **Scullin** (6), **Morritt**, **D Di Marco**, **R Payne**, **C Payne**, **Holdsworth** (North Brunswick).

Match of the round in **F Section** saw **Princes Hill** at home to **Commonwealth Bank**. There was nothing between the two teams in the first half but **Commonwealth Bank** asserted themselves in the all important third term and looked to be well in command. An early effort by **Princes Hill** breathed some life into the contest before the Bank sealed the game, final scores 11.13 to 9.14. Best players – **I McCrimmon**, **Columbine**, **W McCrimmon**,

Chibley (3), **Anderson**, **Foletti** (Commonwealth Bank) and **Mannix**, **K Hehir**, **Cockerall**, **R Carroll**, **A Demir**, **L Cattagio** (Princes Hill).

The leading goal kickers in each senior section were – **A Section**, **Yeo** (Old Melb) 43; **B Section**, **Kaye** (AJAX) 33; **C Section**, **McFarlane** (Coburg) 49; **D Section**, **Martin** (MHSOB) 55; **E Section**, **Scullin** (North Brunswick) 45; **F Section**, **Hille** (Uni Reds) 50.

40 YEARS AGO – 1969

Victoria's supremacy in interstate football took a hit when **South Australia** inflicted a crushing 55 loss against the VAFA in Adelaide. A real challenge down in **Tasmania** as well with the Victorians not breaking clear until the final term to win by 26 points.

A Section Field Umpires were – **Peter King**, **Donald G Dodd**, **Pat Loy**, **John Posetti** and **Bill Mason**. In **B Section** – **Ken Jorgenson**, **Trevor Rowe**, **Darryl George**, **Graeme Simpson** and **Harry Marks**.

50 YEARS AGO – 1959

It was an interesting Saturday in **A Section** as both the **University** teams, **Blues** and **Blacks**, lost their respective matches and as a result their places in the top four were taken by **Old Scotch Collegians** and the **Old Xaverians**. Being the start of the return round of matches, this was not a good sign for the students! The **Blacks** had predictably been defeated by second placed **Old Paradians** but the **Blues** were un-predictably thrashed by a determined **Ormond** outfit. Nothing seemed to go right for the **Blues** as **Ormond** went to a 22 point lead at quarter time with the aid of a good breeze. As the wind abated in the second term the **Blues** panicked a bit and their kicking was uncharacteristically untidy while **Ormond** maintained an open forward zone a kicked 5 goals. The students were better in the second half but the "bird had flown" and **Ormond** rejoiced with the 11.13 to 3.12 victory. 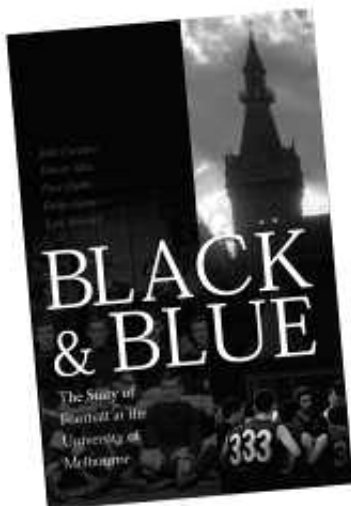
Ever thought that your club may well have played against a club that has won 63 premierships in 147 years?

This fantastic quote from the late President of the United States speaks of the efforts that all coaches would like of their players. It talks about the understanding that you have to be prepared to fail if you are to succeed, and of the perseverance required to triumph. North Brunswick are starting to experience the rewards of perseverance, as Richmond Central have before them. Let's hope that Chadstone will soon also enjoy reward for their hard work. U19 SECTIONS

U19 PREMIER

Plenty to get through this week so I won't bang on too much about last round as results went pretty much to plan with the exception of the Beaumaris / SBMT result. I tipped The Sharks by plenty and am still wiping the egg from my brow as The Tigers showed there is still plenty of life in their season reclaiming a spot in the top four at the turn after a solid home win.

So, it's that time of the season where we can now make an educated call on who's who in the U19 Premier zoo. Every side has now met and while some teams will be confident of playing more than the remaining 9 home and away games others will be hoping for greater success through the reverse draw or face the dreaded "R" word. While we like to look at the positives in any section the nature of the VAFA comp is that two sides in every section must make way for two promoted sides and while it may be cruel to be thinking like this in late June the reality is that for every winner there is a loser and losing too often in this comp means Adios hombre. U19 Premier section is unique in that while two teams drop, due to the geographical nature of the sections below, it may not be the two sides at the bottom of the ladder. For example, if we look at the ladder today the top 5 teams are geographically situated South of the bottom 5 sides meaning that Beauy, sitting in 5th, are technically the lowest placed South team and could find themselves in U19 South 1 had this been the ladder post round 18. Common sense would surely prevail and if the status quo remained with Old Trinity and Marcellin staying in positions 9 & 10 then one would have to assume OT would drop to North, Marcellin to South given that The Eagles are 1 street address further South on Bulleen Rd. If I was coaching any of these sides I'd still be thinking I was a chance at finals because there is still plenty of football to come. With that in mind here are my mid-season report cards and expectations for the 10 clubs.

De La Salle (Blues) 9/10 – De La loses a mark for dropping their round 1 encounter to Old Xav's who early doors were the form team of the comp. Since then De La have beaten all comers and maintain the comps most lethal attack. Stephen Muller with 49 goals is streets ahead of any other goal kicker and De La Coach Jon Edgar can sleep soundly knowing his defence is as miserly as they come. Get over Old Scotch and Xav's in the next two weeks and they will get to wear the home shorts in semi #2.

Old Xavarians 8.5/10 – Started the season on a high and have not looked back, their only hiccup coming a couple of weeks ago against Uni Blues. The Dino-mites have an even spread of talent with Hamish Buckley and Shaun Cross having standout years. Dan Noonan is the go to forward with 18 goals from his 5 appearances but its down back where The Claret and Stout are strangling their opponent's ability to score being the only side yet to have 500 points kicked against them. Beat Old Scotch in round 14 and Xav's will secure second spot.

Old Scotch 8/10 – Dobby's boys are flying and with a bit of

luck against Xav's a few weeks back could be on equal points in 2nd spot. Max Davis and Fraser Macfarlane are stars for The Cards while an even spread of 5 goal kickers in double figures shows many avenues to goal. With school holidays upon us some handy types from the APS team could help lift The Scotchies over De La this week and make things very interesting late in the season. 6 home games to come doesn't hurt the cause either.

St Bedes Mentone Tigers 6/10 – Sitting in fourth at the turn with 5 wins is a disappointing effort for last year's champs. Inconsistency has been the tale of the tape down Mentone way and a dodgy percentage of only 79% (8th in the comp) shows there is a big gap between The Tigers best and worst. Still, Dean Zagami and Adam Jones are showing great signs and if Michael Meehan can get on the field more then I'd expect The Beeders to definitely start to gain back some percentage and challenge for fourth spot.

Beaumaris 5/10 – The Sharks started the season looking like a seasoned Premier outfit. Reality set in when they came up against the top three sides over a four week period and then inexplicably dropped one to Uni Blacks which may come haunt them if stranded 4 points outside of the finals race. Will Murton and James Bliesner lead the way with consistency and durability and if The Sharks can overcome Blacks (rnd 13), SBMT (rnd 14) and Blues (rnd 17) then they should find themselves in the white shorts in the first semi.

Uni Blues 5/10 – As expected The Bluebaggers took some time to get going and come to the turn looking good having taken the scalp of Old Xav's and pushing Old Scotch all the way only to kick themselves out of a winning position. The loss to Rupo hurts but if Tyson Day and Jack Maxwell continue to create opportunities for Jack Townley up front then The Blues may start to beat more sides above them while learning to smash those below. They must beat The Tigers, Sharks and Blacks along with one of the top 3 while not slipping up against teams 8-10 to play finals. What could possibly go wrong?

Uni Blacks 5/10 – Blacks at times have played some very good footy recording solid wins against the lower sides and pushing Xav's and Old Scotch. Debacles against St Bedes and De La have hurt the ladder position and while Shane McNamara and Andrew Rodgers have been fantastic all year Uni Blacks are struggling to find enough goals. Old Trinity can determine which 1 section they go to though. Beat Marcellin they go to North, beat Rupō they go South.

This week I'll take The Cardinals, Old Xavs, SBMT, Uni Blues, and Marcellin.
