



## JULY CAN BE TOUGH

Over the last couple of weeks, I have been to a number of VAFA games and spoken to many club representatives. It seems everyone has mentioned the same thing. *"You wouldn't believe how many people we have out this weekend."*

July is certainly the month for injuries, illness, school and university holidays and the snow. This is the nature of VAFA footy and it occurs every year.

Some clubs seem to get down about this and think it a phenomenon that occurs only at their club. Not so. Every club is in the same boat and it's those that don't dwell on the injuries, but get on with the task of winning games that emerge stronger.

Wet and cold training nights are not as inviting and it doesn't take much for numbers to slip away. A re-commitment at this stage of the year can be pivotal in achieving a club's goals.

The depleted numbers do cause issues in the reserves, Club XVIII and under age competitions. Scraping the numbers together to fill a team can mean there aren't enough officials to get through the day. Now is not the time to let our standards slip.

The integrity of our games cannot be compromised, so I urge clubs to get their injured players volunteering their time to assist these teams as a timekeeper, boundary or goal umpires.

A number of games have been commencing lately without the required officials and this does nothing for the image of the VAFA or the game itself.

Brian Goodman, Brad Lowe and the umpiring department have the same issues. The

introduction of the Under 18's this year has added more matches to an already busy schedule.

Still, the umpiring department has had significant growth in the last 5 years.

- 2004 – 103 Field Umpires for 120 appointments
- 2005 – 129 Field Umpires for 120 appointments
- 2006 – 135 Field Umpires for 118 appointments
- 2007 – 137 Field Umpires for 118 appointments
- 2008 – 144 Field Umpires for 120 appointments
- 2009 – 143 Field Umpires for 128 appointments

Unfortunately, the Club XVIII competition has only 26 field umpires for 42 vacancies.

In the last two weeks, there have been thirty-eight, then thirty-seven umpires missing. 105 umpires are obviously not enough to fill 128 appointments, but incredibly; only one match had a single VAFA umpire. Twenty-two umpires doubled up to save the day and we should be grateful to them. They did a morning under-age game and followed up again that afternoon. All seven umpires who officiated in the Sunday's A Section match had appointments the previous day

The commitment of our umpires should not be underestimated. Just last weekend a neighbouring metropolitan league's umpires went on strike and all senior matches were cancelled. Thankfully, we have a strong umpires association that works in partnership with the board and administration to ensure conditions and standards are maintained on and off the ground.

Yes, July can be a tough month for all involved. Please be mindful of the stresses that are being placed on all stakeholders and if your club can get through the winter, the rewards in August and September will make it all worthwhile.

Round 11 delivered mild surprise rather than outright shock and September prospects changed marginally despite a slight rearrangement of the premiership ladder. The Big Three did the business, as tipped widely (though not necessarily here) and of the middle four fighting for an edge, only Old Scotch took the chocolates.

Scotch looks more threatening now than at any time since late in the final term on Opening Day, when **James Byrne** injured his knee in a freak accident. At headquarters last Saturday, they certainly didn't let Old Essendon under their guard. The Bombers kept it close for a half, let it slip in the third and took castor oil in large doses in the final term, as the Cards added seven without reply to the ledger. Thirteen players wearing red guernseys snared majors, with Scotch scion **Scott Sherwen** managing three in a BOG performance. Injuries have threatened to derail the season at Camberwell – they had six out last week - but they're hanging in and now sitting in fourth spot, with players, good players, still to return. Coach **Banfield** was extremely happy with the effort. **Tom Wilson** and **Dan Cooper** were best for the Essendonians in another disappointing loss.

In the battle for supremacy of the jungle, the Tigers had little trouble with the Lions, romping away to a 71 point victory. After a few weeks of uncharacteristic planetary behaviour, the stars appear to be aligning again at Brindisi Street for another big assault on the finals. **Peter McGettigan** shot often and straight, while **Heller, Kane, Groves** and multiple **Wintles** – unknowns to most A Section fans a year ago, but household names now – all performed well for SBMT. **Trent Rutherford** again did well for Collegians, but their team performance was well down on their previous effort. Last year's runner-up has sacrificed thirty goals in percentage in their last two losses and Saturday's pole-axing was not the way teammates would like to have honoured **Jono Dixon**, who played his 200th.

Marcellin was in serious trouble as Old Brighton turned it on at Bulleen. The Tonners' opening half was, according to those close familiar with the ways at the Beach, as good a half as they'd played all year. Their second half, in contrast, and by any measure, was a total train wreck. Off the rails - over the bridge - into the chasm below – no survivors. They managed just one goal after the long break while the Eagles helped themselves to eight, and the trip back to Brighton was a

longer one than usual. **Tom "It's not unusual" Jones** was Marcellin's best and **Jon Bortolotto** kicked four. **Tom Mentiplay** and **Luke Mann** were strong targets for the visitors early and booted three apiece, though opportunities evaporated after the long break.

University Blues threatened to end Old Xaverians' nine game win streak, but could not sustain the required pressure all the way. The Varsity looked up to the task and took a fourteen point lead in the second stanza, but Xavs added three into the wind before the long break to snatch the lead. The Red 'n' Blacks looked to be home as three quarter time approached, but the home team hit back hard in the fourth. Despite their efforts and a strong breeze at their backs, the Xavs rallied and kept the points safe. **Chris "Sparky" Larkins** played his best game yet for the victors, and the twin towers **Matt Handley** and **Damian Lynch** booted three apiece. **Sam Roache** did well for the Blues while **Alistair Neville** showed some of his old class.

De La Salle is the quickest team in A Section and wasted no time in showing their intent against Old Ivanhoe at Sportscover Arena on Sunday. On a cool, overcast afternoon with the wind largely absent, DLS kicked five at each end to lead by nine goals at the long break. The second half saw an improved return from the Browns, but De La added another five in the third term, ending all remaining chance of a late comeback. Luke Jarvis, who has made an indelible impression on all who have watched him (and stood him) this season, got the votes for the Blue and Golds in a real team effort, while Hayden Heta rucked tirelessly for the vanquished.

Old Xaverians beat Marcellin by 20 goals last time out. Can Marcellin a) improve; and b) improve by enough to trouble the league pacesetter? Yes and almost certainly no. In previous years, Xavs might have been odds-on to drop the game at the Uni, but infused with some youth, they have unearthed brand new fangs this season. They certainly won't let this one slip.

The depleted and deflated Old Ivanhoe host St Bede's Mentone Tigers at Chelsworth. For ten weeks we've been suspecting a Brown revival is just around the corner, but it won't be this week with the visitors just too talented and too desperate to stay in the hunt for the double chance.

Old Scotch will test their mettle against one of the comp's real fliers in what might emerge as the game of the round. De La Salle is fleet-of-foot but the Cards are no slouches moving the ball around the park either. The Scotchies have a real shot at home, while De La can play anywhere. Both teams usually crank it up early, so expect a top first quarter. I suspect the visitors will prevail, but I could be under-rating the home team.

Collegians return to the Trott, which given their recent horrors on the road, will be a good thing for their aspirations of a season rescue. Old Essendon, who have not performed to their own expectations (or those of many others) will find it tough here. On paper, it's no contest and that may well prove to be the case on the field too, though we know the Bombers will turn up and give it a shot. The question is, will the Lions?

The game at the Beach will almost certainly yield a firm view about Old Brighton's chances. We wrote them off too early last winter and they came within a couple of minutes of the double chance. But that was then, this is now. They are struggling with injuries, but of greater concern is the form of those who are fit and well. Stick a fork in them if they get beaten here, and they well might against Uni Blues, who have pushed Xavs twice and beaten De La and will likely slug it out with the Cards for fourth spot. But we are getting a little ahead of ourselves ...

You may have heard of the Bali Geckos. You may even have played for them as they rely largely on visiting Aussies to fill their ranks; a favourite expat haunt for travelling AFL players and footy-loving musicians, pollywogs and celebs in the Asia Pacific rim. Not surprisingly, the Bali footy season runs from October to March as the place becomes inundated with footy trips and annual holiday-makers. Geckos stalwart, John Lincoln (expat architect from Perth) co-ordinates scratch matches each Thursday arvo at the Canggu Club (abridged teams known as 'Bali 9s' with three across the forward, centre and back lines) followed by rigorous footy debate, tipping and tippling that goes on well into the steamy, tropical night. The Geckos support several charities on the island assisting under privileged children and victims of the bombings. This is a grassroots footy experience like no other, under the gaze of monkeys, wandering cattle and excitable Balinese kiddies; canopied by banana palms waving in the salty sea breeze, cooling the burn from the waning afternoon sun. ## ROUND ELEVEN REVIEW

After establishing a 32 two point lead in the first half down at Soldiers, Werribee seemed unshakeable as they took on in-form NOBSP. The Cobbers weren't to be brushed aside and despite the wintry conditions, shook off their early malaise to get a nose in front in the third through the good works of **Adams** (7), **Harwood** (3) and **Lewis Citroen**. But the Tigers rallied and took a three point lead – and crucial momentum – into the last huddle. **Daniel Peler** and **Anderson** were pivotal through the midfield, and the final quarter was for the most part dominated by the home team who ran out 17 point victors. Reliable Werribee forwards **Lee** (5) and Taylor cousins **Aaron** (3) and **Andrew** (3) made best use of the excellent delivery and were instrumental in the win.

Prahran has slipped from finals contention into the relegation ruck after a 36 point defeat at the hands of Emmaus St Leos at Bennettswood Oval. The opening minutes of the game saw both sides quickly scoring their first goal, before the home team skipped away to a handy five goal advantage at the first break with a display that defied their last-placed ladder position. The animals slammed on ten goals before the Two Blues managed to find their second and if not for Baker's three goals for the quarter, the margin could have blown out beyond ten goals. The 45 point gap at the half was a fair indication of the performances of the teams to that stage, but in the third quarter Prahran reduced their

turnovers and lifted their work rate to get themselves back into the game, but the Animals found vital goals at crucial stages to keep the lead beyond five goals. The final term became an arm-wrestle as neither side were able to assert any advantage, each adding two goals for the quarter. **Musster**, **Gill** and **Falcone** were best for the Two Blues, while the shining lights for ESL were **Ballard**, **Hickey** and **Nathan Baranello**, **Beluszar** slotting four and **Ymer** three.

Fitzroy were down a couple of players and played host to a hapless Aquinas outfit with multiple gaps in their lineup. Hapless, yes, but courageous nonetheless despite so many missing from their list but they did struggle to find options in front of goal. Cardamone slotted two as the Bloods' only multiple goalkicker, while **McPherson** and **Jess** made noteworthy contributions. The Roys had a far more even spread, and while the margin never blew out, the home team dominated and never looked out of control as they jumped back into fourth spot. Nods to **Atherton**, **Polidoras** and **Dillard** (3).

Sitting just above Aquinas (on a smidge of percentage only) in ninth position following the round, South Melbourne Districts took on the Rupo giants at Lindsay Hassett oval, and despite a seemingly Herculean task were highly competitive and gave a good accounting of themselves. Most would've anticipated a pedestrian Rupo victory in the order of ten goals or so, but the SMD defenders clamped down on the oft-glamorous Rupo forward line whose inaccuracy was telling. Cheevers and Humphreys stood up for SMD with **Kealy** contributing two goals, while Rupo boys **McDonald**, **Short** and **Phillips** (2) were best for the visitors. **Leigh Brennan** was kept to a paltry two goals by his standards, but continues to lead the goal kicking competition with an impressive 51 majors to date.

The showdown between Whitefriars and Old Mertonians at Donvale was a classic 8-point game as the struggle continues in the ladder's upper-to-middling echelon. The Panthers came into this game after a close win over Fitzroy following a couple of disappointing weeks. OM desperate to consolidate a place in the four, just as the Friars were intent on maintaining their excellent run as they challenge Werribee for the penultimate poszbie. The home team secured the first quarter ascendency with a 21 point lead, but the Panthers clawed their way back in the second with a six goal burst. Three points separated the sides at the main change, as coaches **Feutrell** and **Hayes** implored bigger efforts and greater consistency from their charges. **Lane** (3), **Norton** and **Chicken Palmer** were giving their all for OM, but the Friars were relentless in the third and took a decisive 26 point lead into the final term. Prahran will regain some composure with a win away over Aquinas, just as Old Mertonians expect the four points at home to South Melbourne Districts to get back some self-belief. But no surprises expected at Sunbury despite something of a reinvigoration from NOBSP. Rupo's wins are becoming less regulation as the season thickens, but I think they'll wave farewell to the Cobbers after a tidy five goal win and some pleasant post-match hospitality.

His fitness and ability enabled him to achieve a total of 5 A-grade Grand Finals and 2 B-Grade Grand Finals on the boundary, matching his skills with both brothers **Denis** and **Ian** who also umpired with the VAFA.

As a field umpire, **Wayne's** greatest achievement was umpiring the 1989 C-Grade Grand Final.

Off the field **Wayne** was involved in the workings of our administration and leading our association as President in 1988. Wayne also had the pleasure of watching his daughter **Lisa** join our group on the boundary.

### Only Gibbo

With the new digital technology and the amount of photos that can be stored on the memory card, it would take about five years before developing is required.

And just for you, **Gibbo**, you can still take it to a camera shop for developing.

### Benny's Rule of the Week

#### 15.12 FREE KICK - DELIBERATE RUSHED BEHINDS

A Free Kick shall be awarded against a Player from the defending Team who intentionally Kicks, Handballs or forces the football over the attacking Team's Goal Line or Behind Line or onto one of the attacking Team's Goal Posts. In assessing whether a Free Kick should be awarded under this Law, the field Umpire shall give the benefit of the doubt to the Defender. A Free Kick awarded under this Law shall be taken at the point where the football crossed the Goal Line or Behind Line or from the relevant Goal Post.

### Interpretation:

When an Umpire is determining whether to award a free kick for a deliberate rushed behind the considerations are:

- What is the player's intention?
- Is the player contesting the ball?
- What is the degree of pressure the player is under?
- Was there a team mate in the vicinity of where the ball crossed the scoring line?

In summary, the benefit of the doubt will be given to a defender who is under direct pressure in a contest, or whose primary objective is to spoil or touch the ball before it goes through for a goal.

### Upcoming monthly meeting

The next VAFAUA monthly meeting will take place at the VAFAUA Clubrooms at Elsternwick Park on Thursday 30 July. This is a particularly important night with the notification of and voting on Life Memberships. All umpires are encouraged to attend.

### Quality Assurance Project

This year the VAFAUA Executive has commenced a quality assurance project that we hope all umpires will get involved in. This project will help to highlight the positives and negatives of the various VAFA venues around Melbourne and the way the clubs accommodate the umpires. Issues such as ground conditions, umpire safety, change room facilities and refreshments are covered in the match day questionnaire.

Change room facilities are particularly relevant in today's environment where female umpires share change rooms and sometimes the rooms need to be big enough to accommodate large umpiring panels.

Forms are in the VAFAUA rooms and should be filled out and submitted with the match day paperwork.

This is a great way to acknowledge the clubs that are making an effort to welcome the umpires to their grounds and to assist other clubs to make the appropriate improvements to their facilities.



Balaclava kicked clear again in the third quarter and went into the last term 7.10 to 2.7 and the upset of the season in **C Section** seemed a certainty. With **McKenzie** and **Connell** leading the charge, Haileybury determined they would not have their winning sequence disturbed and they piled on 6.5 while Balaclava failed to score. Haileybury’s 8 point victory, 8.12 to 7.10, confirmed to all comers that regardless of the state of the game, they would prove to be very difficult to beat at any time. Power House made a statement early in the last with some quick goals but Thomastown steadied and ran out winners 16.12 to 10.6. ## 30 YEARS AGO – 1979

Pushing further ahead in the third quarter with their quality forwards sharing it around, Brighton held an unassailable lead by three quarter time but in the last term, they relaxed unexpectedly as Coburg scored 7 goals to gain some respect before siren time. Final score in Brighton’s favour 13.19 to 12.9. Best players – **Warnock, Wilson, Hamilton (5), Templeton (3), Murphy, King** (Old Brighton) and **Mann, Sykes (5), Judge, N Beattie, Cottsworth, G Green** (Coburg).

In **D Section**, second placed **Bulleen Templestowe** travelled to **St Bedes Old Collegians** and despite having plenty of the ball into the wind, kicked inaccurately (1.6)

The win also firmed Parade’s position in the top four; they were now 2 games clear in fourth spot. Coburg had fought back to be within 10 points at half time after Parade opened brilliantly. In a tight tussle during the third quarter, Parade inched ahead to increase their lead to 15 points but in the last term, Coburg’s resistance fell away and the final score in Parade’s favour – 12.6 to 8.6. Best players – **Gordon, Quinlan, O’Brien, Foster Burt, Williams** (Parade) and **King, Ebbage, Parkes, Hanley, Wharfe, Molloy** (Coburg).

In **C Section**, the match between **Commonwealth Bank** and **Old Carey** presented a number of connotations, among them the Bank wanted to protect their top position and Carey needed to kick clear of the relegation area. The bankers were impressive with some early goals but Carey tightened up and scored a late one to trail by only 2 goals at the first break. Bank stepped on the gas in the second quarter and played like the top side but it was all Old Carey in the third term and they trailed by only 2 points at the final break. Carey continued to apply the pressure to the bankers but could not sustain it. The Bank made the most of a couple of opportunities with goals to **O’Brien and Robb** and then went on to a comfortable win, 10.8 to 6.7. Best players – **Cook, McCrimmon, Saynor, McGibbons, Brewin, Borrack** (Commonwealth Bank) and **Watson, R Elliott, D’Ambrosio, Gamble, Green, Redford** (Old Carey).

## 50 YEARS AGO – 1959

In **C Section**, top met bottom – undefeated **Power House** and winless **Malvern**. Would there be any form of upset on a very windy day? Not at all and even though Power House kicked 17.26; they completely annihilated the hapless Malvern who managed 1.9 for the game. It seemed that no one was likely to stop Power House, three games clear of the rest plus substantial percentage. Best players – **Gordon (7), Crane, Kellock (3), Thompson, Egan, Hughes** (Power House) and **Darmody, Dee, Bibby, Keeping, Kilner, Booth** (Malvern).

## 10 YEARS AGO – 1999

In **E Blue Section**, Elsternwick were at home to **Peninsula Old Boys** and a win for the Wicks would enable them to draw level with the Pirates and be right in the mix for the top four. Peninsula had other ideas and handled the confined spaces of the minor Elsternwick ground superbly in the first
