This year's program of representative football culminates with our Seniors and Under 19s playing against the VCFL at the Junction Oval. The senior match is being promoted as a Championship of Victoria battle after our win against the Eastern Football League earlier in the season.

VAFA representative matches were once a pathway to the AFL and may be again. Most of the AFL recruiting assessments are complete by the end of the TAC Under 18 competition, with the physical attributes of the top chances identified. However, athleticism and skill are not the only components that go to make an elite footballer. In today's sport, integrity, intelligence and team spirit are also vital.

These are too often ignored by the recruiters, who it seems can see no further than assets that can be measured with a tape measure or a clock. At our under age matches this year, these less definable qualities have been on display, but I wonder whether the scouts noticed?

Last week's Age article by Martin Flanagan on Melbourne's win against West Coast struck a chord with me. He described the type of character one needs to play league football. One current AFL captain and another one of recent times came from the VAFA pathway.

Of James McDonald (former Old Xaverians premiership player), Flanagan said: There is an authenticity about the Melbourne captain that transcends fashion...he is brave like James Hird and Michael Voss were brave. In build, he is slight but he is one of those players whose courage is absolute.

If I were writing a piece on Richie Vandenberg (former Uni Blues and VAFA Under 19 rep player), I would use similar analogies.

McDonald and his teammates, of course, were playing in some part for their leader Jimmy Stynes, whose own courage and unselfishness were learned in an amateur sports environment where the value of team is paramount. We hope these qualities continue to serve him well in his current fight.

Such qualities are found in many VAFA footballers and I am confident that in tomorrow's matches we have some young men who fit this bill, men of substance who are relentless in their pursuit of the team game, who focus on the challenge of being part of a group that must work together to achieve something.

Whilst I have highlighted the benefits for AFL clubs of looking long and hard at VAFA players, there is also a big benefit for our own clubs in having one or more of their number wear the Big V.

Not only have they played in a match at a higher level that placed extra pressures on their decision-making, but they have had the opportunity to mix with the other leaders in our competition.

Players returning from Big V duty have a presence that helps create a healthier respect for opponents and ensures that our club games are played with better spirit.

Last week, they were opponents, and next week, they will be again. This week, however, they'll be wearing the greatest footy jumper of all and playing together for the same cause.

I wish both teams and the umpires well and may we have a great day at the footy.

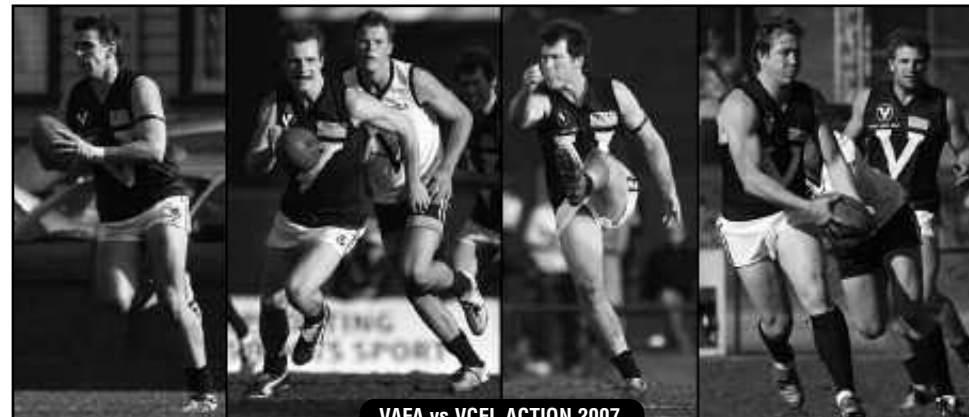

Excitement has ticked into overdrive for the clash of the ladder leaders Caulfield and MHSOB this week. Forget St Kilda versus Geelong under the roof at the stale Etihad Stadium, this will be a suburban football epic of the highest proportions with the house full sign bound to appear well before the 2.00pm kickoff. The game is even likely to draw a bigger audience than that which gathers next door at Caulfield Racecourse for Sir John Monash Stakes Day.

## AROUND THE GROUNDS

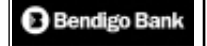

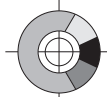

# ... Retrospective

## 5 YEARS AGO – 2004

In **C Section** it was an important game between **Therry** and **AJAX** in terms of the relegation possibilities. Both teams needed a win to improve their chances of staying in C Section. A great first quarter ensued with some clever goals to both teams but a three point lead to Therry. AJAX had the better of the second term to be 11 points up at half time with Gold and Rapoport working well. Therry grabbed back the lead in the third term as Goodwin up forward and Elliott were outstanding. The final term consisted of strong, quick movement but Therry, on their home turf, proved a little better on the day to win by 4 points. Best players – **D Goodwin (5), Elliott, Castaldi, Russell, Baker, M Reynolds (Therry) and Rapoport, Gold, Blieden, J Segal, Blashki, Krafcher (AJAX)**. The central umpires were **Jeremy Heffernan and Ian Semmens**.

After 25 years of involvement with **Hampton Rovers**, **Matthew McKellar** reached the milestone of **400 games** for his club and this feat had only been delayed of late due to a broken jaw sustained in the early part of the season. Matthew commenced with the Rovers as a 10 year old and was a past **premiership captain** and **best and fairest winner**. Another Rovers' milestone was completed when **Stephen Anderson** recorded his **250th VAFA game**. Stephen was also an early starter at Hampton with the Under 9's and his achievements were many. Past **Club best and fairest winner**, past **premiership captain** and **C Section best and fairest in 2000**. To date Stephen had played in **396 games** for the Rovers.

The undefeated **University Blacks** team travelled to the home of the **Aquinas Old Collegians** with the Aquinas team not enjoying the best season in **D1 Section**. The Blacks were quickly into stride but failed with their inaccuracy to tie the game up in the first quarter. They were no better in the second quarter with 5 behinds only whereas the Bloods managed a couple of goals and were confident of placing some pressure on the Blacks in the second half. Goals continued to be hard to come by for the Blacks but Aquinas smelled blood and drew within 3 points at three quarter time. In the third term the Blues "stepped on the gas" and drew right away and continued in the final term, finishing with a really good win, 21.22 to 9.10. Best players – **Anderson, North (6), Ryall (4), Vogels, Sanders, Fulton (Uni Blues) and Frankenburg (3), Evans, Miles, Simon, Rodgers, Eager (Old Scotch)**.

**A Section** coaches were **Kevin Collins (De La Salle), Tony Paatsch (Marcellin), Tony Pappotto (Old Haileybury), Stuart Glascott (Old Ivanhoe), Neil Ross (Old Melburnians), Wayne Harmes (Old Scotch), Tim O'Shaughnessy (Old Xaverians), Garry Foulds (St Bernards), Mike McArthur-Allen (St Kevins) and Grant Williams (Uni Blues)**.

The squad to play against the **Victorian Country Football League Combined Side** was finalised and would hope to "tip the ledger" in favour of the VAFA 4-3 the following weekend. **Denver Artz (Hampton Rovers), Cameron Aubrey (Old Melburnians), Nick Mitchell – VC, Adam Merrington (St Bernards), Andrew Ramsden, Glen Hatfield (Old Trinity), Steve O'Flynn, David Waters (Marcellin), Blair Robertson (De La Salle), Simon Wood, Dan Richardson, Ben Coughlan, Adam Jones, Andrew Dillon, Simon Lethlean (Old Xaverians), Andrew Lamb, Marcus Dollman, Ben Garvey (St Kevins), Gill McLachlan – VC, George DeCrespigny (Uni Blues), Steve Hume, Tim Holt, Stephen Collins (Old Scotch), Matthew Jackson (Old Brighton), Ben Jordon (NOBS) and Mark Seccull – Capt (Old Haileybury)**. Coach was **Nick Bourke** assisted by **Rob Fuller, Bruno Conti, Peter Hutchinson and Max Lyon**.

## 20 YEARS AGO – 1989

In **E Section** the **Doveton (4th)** versus **Brunswick (7th)** was critical at this stage of the season. Doveton were the home team and jealously guarded their home ground advantage but things went awry in the first quarter as Brunswick slammed on 8.1 to 1.3. Doveton used the breeze well in the second term but were 6 points down at half time. Doveton took the lead in the third quarter with 6 goals to 4 and in the last quarter, their all round strength prevailed as they ran out winners 19.13 to 15.4 and took third spot as an added prize. Best players – **J Reiger, Beugellar (4), Ashwood, S Reiger, Kay, Warren (Doveton) and Gunning, Jones, Spezza, D Stevens, Black, Kenneigisser (Brunswick)**.

In **F Section**, second placed **St Andrews** did not have it all their way against **Commonwealth Bank** who were sitting behind them in third place. There was a considerable difference in ladder standings, 8 points and 33%. It was an even, low scoring contest until the last 5 minutes of the game at which stage St Andrews' greater fitness and speed kicked in; they won 7.12 to 5.8 and Commonwealth Bank's loss sent them tumbling down to fifth place. St Andrews were so impressed with their win they gave the old standby – "great team effort by all players". Commonwealth Bank identified their best – **Abrahams, Joyce, Pitts, Buttigieg, Kraska**.

## 30 YEARS AGO – 1979

Fourth place in **E Section**, held by **Bulleen United**, was under attack from any one of five teams, the whole section being a wonderfully competitive group. **Old Mentonians** played **ANZ Bank** and a win may make them the main challengers. Mentonians were expected to win as ANZ were on the bottom of the ladder even after having recorded 4 wins. The first quarter was the decider as Mentonians slammed on 9 goals to the Zedders' solitary major. Although the Bankers made up some ground in the second quarter and were competitive in the third term, seven goals to two in the last quarter not only gave Mentone a great win (20.18 to 8.14) but moved them up two places to fifth spot, only 2 points behind Bulleen United. Best players – **Coutts, Wilson (4), O'Toole, Truslove, R Ericksen (3), Willis (Mentonians) and S Gale, Hickey, Allen, Lawrence, Seehusen, Wescott (ANZ)**.

It was the battle of the banks in **F Section**, between **Commonwealth** and **National**, Comm Bank sitting fourth and NAB lowlier in eighth place. After an excellent battle all day it was National Bank that emerged victorious and lessened Commonwealth's 8 point buffer over fifth placed Uni Reds. Best players – **Reeves, Cordy (4), Hogg (5), G Bate, Tassone, Walkendon (National Bank) and Reeves, Milton, Davis, Columbine, Brown, Anderson (Commonwealth)**.

## 40 YEARS AGO – 1969

It was a very important clash in **B Section** between **St Kilda CBC** and **Uni High School Old Boys**, 9th and 10th respectively, as this may be the last chance for these teams to improve their chance of avoiding relegation. St Kilda held a percentage advantage and in the opening quarter had all the play with 3.6 to 0.1. UHSOB responded magnificently in the second quarter and kicked 6.3 to 1.1 to take the lead into the half time break. It was tough and tight in the third with Uni High taking a 6 point advantage in to the last term. In a very strong performance in the last quarter, UHSOB were clearly the deserved winners, 13.10 to 7.11 and were now only 1 game behind Footscray Tech Old Boys and the fight for relegation was back on. Best players - **Ashmead (3), Horton (4), Reid, Wayne Taylor, Barker, Parkes (UHSOB) and Schwarzman (4), Drinan, S Clinch, V McCandlish, K White, P Carey (St Kilda CBC)**.

**A Section field umpires** were – **N Sharpe, D Jenkin, B Hagarty, G Marshall, D G Dodd** and **B Section - J Posetti, D Malcolm, B Mason, P Doherty, G M Simpson**.

Milestones recorded were as follows – **Tooronga-Malvern's Paul McLean (200 games) and Ian Downs (150), MHSOB's Ian Turnbull (150), Old Brighton's Graeme Templeton (150), Caulfield Grammarians' John Hore (100), St Kilda CBC's Terry Dankert (100), Alphonington's John Tiedgens (100), Commonwealth Bank's Les Radford (100) and West Brunswick's Alec Martin (100)**.

## 50 YEARS AGO – 1959

In **D Section** it was a tough, rugged encounter between **Footscray Tech Old Boys (4th)** and **St Kilda CBC (2nd)** with plenty at stake. A strong wind prevailed in the first half and both teams made good use of it with Footscray holding a 3 point lead at half time. In **E Section**, **Old Brighton** continued on their merry way with a huge victory over the unfortunate **Commercial Bank** team 29.29 to 4.7. It was completely one way as the ladder leaders firmed even further as premiership favourites and their outstandingly clever rover, **Barry Pryor**, kicked 11 goals. Best players – **Pryor (11), Ridley (5), Reuss, Peachey, D Sedgwick, Morris (Old Brighton) and Vear, Robinson, Hutchinson, Davidson, Jones, Stevenson (Commercial Bank)**.



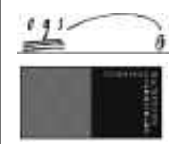
