Last Sunday was a great day for VAFA football and at the same time a sad one, as it seems the curtain is drawing on football at the Junction Oval.

It is anticipated that Cricket Victoria will take over the lease of the ground and become a cricket venue 12 months a year, shutting out all Australian Rules matches.

Obviously that will have an immediate effect on one of our clubs, Old Melburnians, who use the ground for matches during the winter. The VAFA has used the ground for the early finals and it is a tragedy for our sport that this ground will be closed.

This ground should not be lost to football. Our peak bodies, the AFL and AFL Victoria, should do everything in its power to lobby the State government and ensure its survival.

The ground has played a unique part in the history of football, firstly as a home to the St Kilda FC for almost a century, then Fitzroy FC for fifteen years. My memories of the ground include the sensational VFA finals in the 70s with names such as Frosty Miller, Buster Harland, Harold Martin and Sammy Kekovich.

The Junction was where Bernie Quinlan and Peter McKenna brought up their tons and Bulldog Murray won his Brownlow. There is a special football feel about the ground and what a tragedy it would be if it closed to our great national game.

What could possibly possess our state government to allow Cricket Victoria access for twelve months a year, thus ending football's run?

Why can't football and cricket co-exist on this ground, like they do on so many other venues around Melbourne? If Cricket Victoria needs a ground to itself, why shouldn't it chase some reclaimed land or other open space to provide Melbourne with a new venue rather than taking one away?

How will Cricket Victoria utilise the Junction in between seasons? Given the conditions in the middle

of the year, I don't know of any fast bowler who would be interested in running through the mud to get to the crease. Perhaps someone will have to invent a game to keep our cricketers fit during those winter months!

Last Sunday approximately 2000 community football supporters flocked to the Junction (how long since cricket has attracted that many there?) to witness two matches, played on a high quality arena, and the games didn't disappoint. Whilst the VAFA went down after the siren for the second time in a row against the Country, we were winners in every other way.

Our disappointment in not winning either game should not cloud the reasons why representative football is played - to showcase our competition and most importantly to provide an opportunity to our players to play at a higher level.

Everyone at the ground last Sunday would have walked away knowing that the VAFA was a strong and vibrant competition that can hold its own with any other. I was certainly proud of all who contributed to the day from the coaching team, medical staff, officials, players and spectators. Organising the day is akin to a grand final without the lead-up games. They are major events and on Sunday we did everything right but get over the line.

This week our focus returns to the season's run home. Two matches left in the clubbies, five in the C – D4 and Unders and six in A and B Sections. Every kick counts as the final battles for places in the four and to avoid relegation begin.

Accordingly our football department's focus this week has been on identifying the best grounds for the finals and we are confident of bringing together another action packed finals series.

With representative commitments complete, there is now a clear run home. Though there is still one-third of the home and away season ahead of us, the first three on the table look already to be locks for September, while the bottom three will definitely miss. For two of those, it'll be a ticket to B Section, with the ducat for the return journey to be purchased at a later date.

The middle four, however, continue to jostle. When the envelopes are distributed their way in six weeks, only one will contain an invitation to the finals. Before the last round, Old Scotch were in fourth, looking handy, but Uni Blues have now vaulted back up the ladder into that slot.

On current form, it is the Varsity that has the most favourable schedule over the next month and a half, but July and August are the season's dog days and often provide surprise. They'll need to, especially for Old Brighton, who alone play all three top sides, only one of their immediate rivals and two of the bottom three. We can't run the red ink though them yet, but with their paltry percentage a big burden, the pencil of popular opinion is poised.

In the cold and the wind that marked Round 12, certainty triumphed over surprise when all favourites saluted. Even inclemency as wild as a Mitch Johnson opening spell did nothing to quell the appetite of the competition's well-fed, while its paupers were left shivering.

Old Xaverians touched up Marcellin by a massive twenty-one goals, registering their fourth 100+ point victory for the season. The Eagles were completely obliterated by **Matt Handley**, who kicked eight goals before receiving an early minute from the coaching bench; **Chris Larkins**, who is playing out of his skin; the redoubtable **Tim Clarke**, who is relishing his role as a midfield maestro; and **Josh Agius**, who never stopped running and crashing and bashing. Marcellin was best served by **Brendan Colville** and **Jonny Blanch**, but were thoroughly outgunned all afternoon.

Old Scotch had a tense duel with De La Salle at Camberwell, but the visitors proved too strong into the breeze in the final quarter. Cardinals' coach Peter Banfield is not looking for honourable losses at this stage of the season, but this was nonetheless a creditable effort that might have even gone their way had their kicking been more precise. **Jacob Gotch** and **David Lowe** were omnipresent and damaging termites

for De La. Both have been in slashing form over the past month, and were again standouts in a very even team performance. **Charlie Tallent** and **James Barton**, who played his first senior game of the campaign, gave plenty for the home team, while **James Byrne** is working his way into some top form after that knee injury that threatened to destroy his season.

Old Brighton looked early winners against Uni Blues as they moved the football into the gale with intent and contempt. It was not to last, however, as Blues applied the Full Nelson and slowly squeezed the life out of the Tonners. **Andrew Lowcock** started in defence for the Varsity, but an injury to **George deCrespigny** sent him forward with good effect. The half-time banter between the clubs as they left the arena hinted that a rugged second-half was on the menu, but it was hardly NRL State of Origin material as Blues managed to snuff out any resistance rather quickly. **John Perrett** tried valiantly for the vanquished, but the old firm of **Mark Paterson** and **Matt Tomey** carried the day.

Despite some early third quarter resistance from Old Ivanhoe, St Bede's Mentone Tigers dominated the day at Chelsworth Park. The Tigers used the wind to their advantage, whether it was it at their backs or in their faces, with some hard running by **Ben Phibbs** and **Sam Anstey** and the strength of **Tim Mavric** and **Simon Richards**. When the Browns threatened, **Jack Hellier** and **Paul Wintle** did the job. The Hoers, still winless since their season opener, got good return from **Richard Butler** and **Stuart Lowe**, but were well off the pace on the ground as well as the scoreboard.

A dark cloud of melancholy has descended upon the Browns' soul and blue skies are not smiling at them, nowhere those blue skies do they see.

Old Xaverians return to Barkers' Road to take on Old Scotch, who may yet have a real sting in their season's tail. The Red and Blacks jealously guard their ascendancy over the Cardinals and won't want to let this one slip. Their win streak, now at eleven, may run through Saturday.

Collegians looked in fine fettle at Sportscover earlier in the year but it's difficult, though not inconceivable, that they will be as good this Sunday against De La Salle. The Lions roared last start, but this is a step up in class that will probably result in a second-place finish.

AROUND THE GROUNDS

The Match of the Year II lived up to expectations early, with league heavyweights Caulfield and MHSOB engaging in a shootout, minus stars **Roger McIntyre** (State Game), **Ben Carboni** (injured) and **Fraser Gehrig** (catching fish barehanded in the Yarra). Caulfield looked to have control going into half time, with forward ace **Slevison** slipping through some late majors to edge the home side ahead. The Unicorns responded with the wind, **Jimmy "Tekken" Tran** breaking the lines with his Stawell Gift speed to kick MHSOB back in front at orange time. At the same moment I Am Invincible scored a dominant win next door in the Sir John Monash Stakes, the Fields produced their own brand of dominance, dispatching the Unicorns with a seven goal last quarter (wind assisted) to remain aloft the 2009 ladder. Veteran **Mark Liddell** had sticky hands, marking everything that came his way to be named the best for Caulfield, aided by the **Sundberg** brothers and little rover **Simon "Wija" Widjaja**.

At the next opportunity the umpire in question pulled **Watts** aside and said, "mate you have to be careful how you speak to us, if you ever get up to A grade you'll never get away with that!" Well done Gunny, great communication skills. Suppose you didn't watch a lot of A section footy last year.

Benny's Rule of the Week

When a point is scored the player must bring the ball back into play from within the goal square according to the rules which state;

(a) After giving a player a reasonable opportunity, the field umpire shall direct a player to kick the football back into play. If a player fails to kick the football back into play after being instructed to do so, the field umpire shall call "Play On". The player shall be required to dispose of the ball in accordance with the Laws 13.1 (b) and (d). Opposing players however may enter the Goal square and tackle the player with the ball once "Play On" is called.

(b) If the field umpire is of the opinion that a player has not kicked the football back into play in accordance with **Law 13.1**, the field umpire shall bounce the football on the centre of the kick off line to recommence play. This means a player CANNOT take the ball back through the goal area as he has not brought the ball back into play within the rules; this is therefore NOT a point but a ball up in the centre of the kick off line.

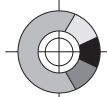

THE POWER OF A NEGATIVE IMAGE

Thinking is a complicated process. A process that can help you find a solution to a problem, or a process that can bring about the very outcome you hope to avoid.

Over the past few years golfers have been advised to have a strong pre-shot routine. This routine usually includes feeling the swing or putt, seeing the flight of the ball and several other elements designed to separate the thinking from the hitting aspects of a shot. The same applies to other set routine skills such as kicking for goal. You only have to watch Matthew Lloyd preparing for his set shots at goal to know what I mean. Unfortunately, many players include some very destructive aspects in their pre-shot routine. One of the most damaging of these is the negative image.

Remember that every time you think of what you want to avoid, you practice making that mistake. The way the mind processes information makes this nasty occurrence happen. Remember the old joke about "Don't think of a purple cow", and, of course, you have to think about that purple cow. You have to think about what you don't want to think about because part of the process is to clearly identify the subject, the purple cow. Of course, a cow is an object and not an action. If you think of an action, especially one that has a strong emotion attached to it, your mind will automatically begin to recall and/or create the experience.

Never ask yourself to do what you don't want to do. This means that when you think of something your mind must process the thought down to the fibres of your muscles. When you think of a water hazard, and hitting it into the water, your mind processes the thought and you must mentally PRACTICE hitting the ball into the water. It doesn't matter if you want it or not. If you think it, you practice it. Avoid the thoughts that force you to practice what you do not want to do. The best way to do this is to occupy your thoughts with

what you want. Focus on the centre of the goals (pick a specific target behind the goals), focus on the feel of a good goal kick, focus on the exact spot where you will put the ball. In the early stages of shot preparation, look up the field, at the target and where the mark is, but when you are ready to actually take your kick your thoughts must focus on the positive, on success. When it's time to kick the ball avoid all thoughts and/or images of failure.

Do not use thoughts such as: "Watch out for the opposing players on the mark", "Keep it out of the dead pocket", "I sure hope I don't kick it there again." or "My last shot was far too short". These negative thoughts force you to think about the very thing that you want to avoid. When you think it, you practice it. Confidently hold the image of the target and take your kick.

It would be ridiculous to believe that you can avoid or eliminate all of your negative images or thoughts. You do not need to fear having these images or thoughts, they will occur. What you can learn to control is the effect that the images have on your game. You do this by controlling when you have them. This means that you control the sequencing of your thoughts. If, as you prepare to kick at the goals, you remember badly shanking a similar kick last week, don't panic. Simply remember to take an extra five seconds and immediately go to a positive image and recall a strong feeling of success. Refocus your mind on the target and execute the kick with all the confidence a good shot at goal requires. Never let a negative image or thought be your last image or thought before you kick. You will probably get what you mentally ask for, so don't ask for the negative, ask for success.

5 YEARS AGO – 2004

In **D2 Section**, **Williamstown CYMS** did not do **Bulleen Templestowe** any favours when they defeated the equal leaders with a great third quarter effort in a low scoring match. It was a really good team effort from the Williamstown boys with a 10 point victory, 9.11 to 8.7. Best players – **Wheeler, Munro, Cocks, Street, Hart** (Williamstown) and **Schneider, Voglis** (4), **Chivers, Clarke, Daskalou** (Bulleen Temp).

It was a really tight, low scoring affair in the **D3 Section**; **Mount Lilydale** versus **Uni High School/Victorian Uni** and in protecting their place in the top four, UHS-VU had to fight every inch of the way before winning 8.7 to 8.5. UHS-VU held a very handy lead in the circumstances at half time (6.4 to 3.2) but the mountain men kept coming and almost “took the chocolates”. Best players – **Carroll, Dimond, Mora, Dolence, Thorp, M Farrelly** (UHS-VU) and **Baker, Roberts, Hayes, Kellett, Carns, Leonard** (Mount Lilydale). **Dimitris Pappas** and **Brian Woodhead** were the central umpires.

In **D4 Section** it was officially a ‘five horse race’ for the finals and **Kew** (2nd) were away to **Bulleen Cobras** (4th). Bulleen on their home ground expected to place a lot of pressure on the strong Kew line-up but by three quarter time had not scored a goal, rather 10 straight behinds while Kew with 8.15 had the situation under control. Umpires Corner, presented by the two veterans, **Leah Gallagher** and **Steve McCarthy**, made note of some milestones from within their fraternity - **Sean Scully Junior 50 games, Gaj Skandakumar 200 games** and **Trevor Flannery 100 games** on the tribunal door as security. Also mention of former great goal umpire, **Don McKenzie** following his hip surgery. **Don** was not only a

good umpire but a dedicated VAFA follower who was enjoying following **St Leos Emmaus** each week where his son was club captain. (**Good to Leah and Macca still running well in 2009 and helping to guide some of the young ump’s – GR**).

10 YEARS AGO – 1999

In **C Section** in extremely windy conditions the scene was set for a great contest between top four teams **Old Mentonians** and **Glen Eira**. Using the wind to advantage in the first quarter, Mentonians kicked six goals with leading C section sharpshooter, **Adam Acreman**, looking particularly dangerous. Glen Eira could only manage 4 behinds into the wind but made up for it in the second quarter with 9.2 although Mentonians kicked four to hold a slender lead. Glen Eira worked really hard into the wind in the third term, scored 3.3 but Mentonians, with **McNish** and **Stroud** also dangerous around goals, making life difficult for Glen Eira. In a fantastic last term each team in turn kicked goals in a great display of contested footy. Although Glen Eira converted 8 times with **Hasell** their main goal scorer, Mentonians had the answers and just held on top win by 4 points, 21.8 to 20.10, excellent conversion given the conditions. Best players – **McNish** (5), **Brooks, Kitto, Acreman** (8), **Carter, Austin** (Mentonians) and **Matt Ryan, Hasell** (8), **Astapenko, C O’Donnell, Wilce, Tkocz** (Glen Eira).

With 12 teams in **D Section** and consequently and unusually a final five, there was plenty of room for changes in the top group. **Caulfield Grammarians** versus **Old Essendon** would be a vital game and Essendon drew first blood and held a very handy lead at quarter time. Held scoreless in the second term, Essendon still held a 2 goal lead at half time then kicked away in the third quarter and held on to severely dent Caulfield’s chances. Best players – **Fletcher, Panagiotopoulos, Fleming, McPherson, Goodger, Dragoljo** (Essendon) and **Oscar, Will, Cassidy, Brohier, McGrath, Pearce** (Caulfield).

Caulfield Grammarians’ Kornel Dachs achieved his **200th game** and had typified loyalty and club spirit throughout his journey with the Grammarians. **Matt Cohen** played his **100th game** for **Old Carey** and had already become an institution at the C’s.

20 YEARS AGO – 1989

In **A Section**, **Ormond** (2nd) took on **Scotch** (7th) and did not have it all their own way. In fact, it took practically the whole game for the Monds to shake off the very tenacious Cardinals, typical of the rivalry between these two teams at this time. Scotch led by 2 points at quarter time which prompted Ormond to slip into top gear in the second term. Newly promoted forward for Ormond, **Darren Roth**, was proving a very handy replacement for regular spearhead, **Paul Schuhkraft**, while **Justin Clarkson** headed the charge for the mid-fielders. Paul Cox’s return from injury also lifted the Monds around the ground. **Peter Brown** was excellent for Scotch along with **John Moir**, who won the ruck battle against the Ormond pair, **Paul McDonald** and **Scott Taylor**. Scotch’s **Andy Smith** was consistent all day for the Cardinals. After seemingly taking control at half time, Ormond again found Scotch willing to take them on in the third quarter and Ormond had to work very hard to maintain their hold on the game, eventually winning 18.14 to 13.16. Best players – **Roth** (5), **Clarkson, P Cox, Russell, Forsyth, David McDonald** (Ormond) and **Brown, Smith, Moir, Hooper, Brady, Kiel** (Old Scotch). Following **Collegians’** narrow loss at the hands of **Old Paradians**, Ormond went to the top of the ladder.

In **B Section**, **Old Brighton’s** first half was far more impressive than their second half against **Uni Blacks**. Squandering a 6 goal lead in the third term, the Tonners had to ‘steady the ship’ in the final term before winning 14.11 to 10.14. Best players – **Burns, O’Connor, Grant** (6), **Murray** (3), **Cooper, Lade** (Old Brighton) and **Van Denderen, Vaughan, Heath, McArthur, Anderson, Gibney** (Uni Blacks). **Old Brighton** remained in second place while the Blacks stayed in the middle of the pack.

30 YEARS AGO – 1979

The threat of relegation was ‘kicking in’ and it always impacts on this wonderful competition that we know as the “Ammos”. With only ten teams in most sections, the fight for survival so often produces results ‘against the tide’. On this occasion, firstly **Ivanhoe** defeated **Ormond** in a high scoring, A Section game that was close from the opening bounce until the final siren. Winning 20.11 to 17.14 may well have removed Ivanhoe from relegation stakes. It was a great game; best players – **Gittos, R Stewart** (3), **McNamara, Shepherd** (3), **B O’Brien, J Brewin** (Ivanhoe) and **Crump** (6), **Boehm** (5), **Fisher, Pearce, Mehrten, Holdsworth** (Ormond).

In **B Section**, middle of the road teams, **Fawkner** and **Caulfield Grammarians** met at the windswept Fawkner Oval and the home team appeared to have the better of their visitors, especially at three quarter time when only their inaccuracy (8.17 to 6.5) kept Caulfield in the game. In a thrilling last quarter, led by **Greg Tootell** (6 goals) and

Warwick Watson, Caulfield piled on 7 goals to Fawkner’s three and at the siren it was 84 points apiece with all players exhausted by their efforts. Best players – **Smith, Rochford, K Ward, Teasdale, T Mills, M Ward** (Fawkner) and **Watson, Lean, Fielden, Bierwirth, Kanis, Voyage** (Caulfield Grammarians).

40 YEARS AGO – 1969

In **C Section**, it was match of the season with top team, **Commonwealth Bank**, travelling to **Alphington** (2nd), who were one game behind. Both teams were well clear of their rivals. The bankers kicked away early before Alphington kicked two late goals in the first term to be within 5 points of the bank. The Bankers asserted themselves in the second quarter to hold a valuable 4 goal lead by the main break. Alphington completely reversed the trend in the third quarter and also outscored the bank in the final term to run out winners 15.11 to 13.9 and now only a percentage advantage had the bank on top of the ladder. Best players – **Williams, Wayman** (3), **McKay** (3), **D Puddy, Alsop, McNamara** (Alphington) and **Radford, Dick, Aldenhaven, Curtin, Borrack, Pretty** (Commonwealth Bank).

In **D Section** it was a thriller at **Parkside** against **Old Trinity** before the home team held on to win 11.8 to 11.5. The loss placed Old Trinity in the relegation area while Parkside were waiting for the opportunity to grab fourth spot. Best players – **Stenlake, D Gleeson, Sammutt, Tolra, Romari, Eames** (Parkside) and **D Cox, Watson, McLean, Kleinart, Farmer** (Old Trinity).

50 YEARS AGO – 1959

Nearing the business end of the season, top team in **A Section**, **Collegians**, thrashed **Old Scotch** with greater determination and more purposeful football. Scotch had kicked the first two goals of the game but Collegians quickly rallied and had the advantage at the first break. **Cowper** was providing Scotch with plenty of drive but the forwards could not capitalize on his good work. **Bennett** was in brilliant form for Collegians having recently come out of retirement, not for the first time. Collegians continued to take their toll on the spasmodic Cardinals and won easily in the finish 16.6 to 4.10. Best players – **Bennett** (8), **Opie, Umkenstein, Sunderland, G Hibbins, L Hibbins** (Collegians) and **McKaige, Cowper, Eggleston, Wilson, Maughan, R Morris** (Old Scotch).

In **B Section**, **Coburg** defeated **Kew** easily, 17.13 to 8.20 and retained the top position. Kew may have missed their chance of finals now, one game plus lots of percentage in fifth place. Despite Kew’s inaccuracy, Coburg had all the answers with their fast play-on style of footy. Best players – **Hillyear, Shaw** (6), **R Dugdale, Gilchrist, Tupper, D Walsh** (Coburg) and **Porter** (4), **Blay, Snell, Woods, Fletcher, Hayes** (Kew).

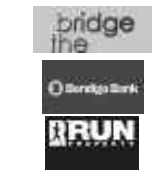

Whilst the Doctor blows in off the Indian Ocean providing welcome relief to a hot summer's day, for the past few weeks the butcher has been taking the hatchet to our football fields and slaughtering any signs of a quality, high-skilled game of football. Through the propensity of our meat merchant to turn a football on its nose and send it spiralling 120 degrees away from the intended target, what has been created are two types of game; The dour but desperate 'trench fight' where every metre is earned through blood, sweat and tears, and the 'see-saw' where a seven goal lead can disappear faster than a parking spot at Northland. While neither may be pretty, either can create a thrilling match, and we saw examples of both on Saturday.

The match of the round lived up to its billing with the top two sides battling out a see-sawing affair at the 'racetrack'. Both sides belied the difficult conditions to kick goals into the savage wind. In the first it was La Trobe who snatched an early lead before a **Nathan Dallas** inspired flurry from the Falcons created a handy buffer at quarter time. With five games to go only four percentage points separate the top two sides with automatic promotion beckoning the side that manages to take the minor premiership.

At Fleming Park Chadstone put tremendous pressure on the home side and managed to restrict North Brunswick to only two goals with the wind. At Kevin Bartlett reserve a classic 'trench fight' was fought out with Kew initially bouncing out to a five goal lead, then only kicking one more for the match as Richmond clawed their way back Both sides would rue their inaccurate kicking, however would have been proud of the intense physical pressure and tackling in a finals type atmosphere. **Sean O'Connor** and **Brendan Dagge** were impressive for the home side who surely missed Daniel Pike in conditions that would have suited his 'in and under' style of play. For Kew, who appear to have turned the corner after a shaky few weeks, **Heath McDermott** and **Aaron 'Phil' Carman** impressed.

Swinburne had first use of the breeze and took full advantage, surging quickly to a seven goal lead against the Cobras. **Ben Cookson** then turned on a scintillating display of midfield football, leading his side to a narrow half time lead. In the third though, the Razorbacks really put their foot down and with their forwards led by **Michael Westland** enjoying the quantity and quality of possession delivered to them, took an eight goal lead into the last. With the wind dying in the last Manningham were unable to peg back the home side despite **Warrick 'Raging Bull' De Vercelli** thinking he was at Pamplona, and splitting packs at will. Swinburne is now on the cusp of the five and with **Zac Scrase** and **Michael Manning** in top form would be setting their sights on September action.

Eley Park would be wishing they had won the toss on Saturday with both reserves and seniors surging home with the sea spray to just fall short of the home side. In conditions not conducive to key forwards both sides managed to find multiple avenues to goal, with nine goal-kickers each. **Ben Price** and **Sam Wright** both continued their fine seasons to lead the Tigers to another important narrow victory, whilst **David Bennett** and **Mitch Dunn** performed well for the Sharks.

Box Hill North have shown improved form over the past few weeks and with **Peter Currie** continuing his excellent return from a serious knee injury, would have given themselves a chance against the Rams. Despite a four goal deficit at half time **Adam Pritchard** was winning a lot of the ball for the demons and the game appeared within reach. In the third however **Jesse Pulkka** and **Haydn Moyes** hit the afterburners and were far too fleet of foot for the home side. **Pulkka** in particular played probably his best game of the year, and set

up several goals for the Mt Lilydale forwards. In the end the Rams stretched their lead out to finish with a dominant 81point victory and their seventh win from their past eight matches.

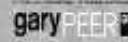

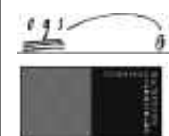
