## GOODBYE AND THANKS.

This weekend marks the end of my final season on the VAFA Board. The Ammos have been a big part of my life over the past 25 years or so, as a player, then a coach and finally as a board member. Along the road, I've played with and against some of the finest ever to grace our competition, mentored some of them too, and worked with many talented people who are committed to building the VAFA and promoting the ideals it represents. The Victorian Amateur Football Association is the best administered and presented football competition outside the AFL. It is not an easy matter to please seventy-three clubs, which have different ambitions, cultures, strengths and weaknesses, but I've found that the things that bind us are greater than our differences.

On Monday night, we presented MHSOB's veteran ruckman Roger McIntyre with the C Section Medal, we paid tribute to Peter Brabender, who has played 407 games with Old Paradians and not one in the Reserves. I made mention too of Andrew Ramsden, the classy Old Trinity warhorse, who has been the mainstay not only of his club, but of Victorian teams as well. These three represent a thousand more who have continued to play VAFA football with their mates when they could have played elsewhere for cash. Playing for the love of their game is a tradition rooted in another time but one that has survived because it has great merit. A century ago, our Association's second President L A Adamson espoused views that are still commonplace in the VAFA: that the team was bigger than the individual, the game bigger than the player, and as Kipling had observed, that triumph and disaster are impostors to be treated in the same fashion.

Today, it is commonplace around our grounds to see players having a drink with those same men that half an hour before they were so desperate to beat. We see those same opponents band together, not as a collection of individuals, but as a team, to represent the Big V.

Many of you would know that I will be taking up a Board position with AFL Victoria, which I am hoping will enable me to continue to fly the flag for the VAFA. With our eleven-thousand registered players and clubs spread across metro Melbourne and beyond, the ammos are a football force.

We seem to have expanded every year. We began our

U18s just this season and that competition looks like doubling in size. We continue our push west, with Point Cook coming in next season. We are taking teams overseas and we are attracting big name players from other leagues who want to catch some of our Ammos fever.

I believe the VAFA is well placed, and perhaps best placed, to meet the challenges facing grassroots football. Our ban on drinking during games has been treated with mirth in some quarters, but there is no doubt that it has a positive effect on both the size and behaviour of our crowds. There is no doubt that some would prefer to go elsewhere, but the number of women and children seen all season at VAFA grounds is strong indication that our people prefer family-friendly football.

In recent years, we have seen less family-friendly on Melbourne's streets. Unfortunately, a few of our players have been unwitting victims in serious assaults. With so many players under our banner, we are obviously not immune from these increasing episodes of senseless and violence. I encourage our clubs to do all they can to educate our young folk of the dangers they face when others have moments of madness. As Edmund Burke observed, "All that is necessary for evil to triumph is for good men to do nothing".

It has been an honour to serve the VAFA and I am confident that our Association will continue to receive strong and passionate guidance from the board and from our staff at headquarters. Our clubs are the real strength of our Association and I salute the efforts of all those who in my time have given their time to ensure their teams perform as best they can. Adamson believed amateur sport prepared a man for war: I believe it delivers far greater bounty than that and that of all the rewards that can be gained from our great game, money runs ten lengths last.

So, this weekend, we hand it over to Xavs and De La; to Old Melburnians and Old Trinity; to Albert Park and to Latrobe University to finish off this special year. Good luck to them. And thanks to all.

### PRELIM REVIEW:

De La Salle rebounded from their second-semi final horrors to defeat University Blues by seventeen points in an intriguing contest. The weather gods were kinder than they had been on Saturday, with temperature, sunshine and wind friendlier than they had been. The skies dribbled a bit early, but the threat of major precipitation disappeared by the time the curtain-raiser began.

Blues had beaten De La twice in the home-and-away and looked to be on the way to a hat-trick in the first quarter when they skipped away to an early lead. **George DeCrespigny** picked up where he left off last Sunday and posted three early goals. Only the run of **Sam Williams** kept De La afloat early and he had a hand in both their first quarter goals after slashing runs down the clubhouse side.

The Varsity would have been happy with the first stanza surplus, to wit, twenty-three points and De La's overuse of the ball in the second did nothing to strip the Blues of confidence, though were some signs that the mercurial **Ben Mannix** might be on song. Uni hit the sheds ten points to the good and De La had the job ahead of them in the third, facing the wind.

The premiership quarter, so dubbed, saw each team with a different objective. Blues needed to ram home their advantage and De La needed to keep its opponent on a leash, ensuring that the margin did not blow out. As it transpired, De La played with the reckless abandon that saw them win fifteen of eighteen in the home and away. Blues scored three majors, but the La Sallians, fired by Woodrow Medalist **Matt Fieldsend** and the aforementioned **Mannix** managed five. They were tied as they hit the huddles one last time, thought here were indeed murmurings among the crowd of another extra-time experience.

The final term saw De La pull away. **Leigh Harrison** was a dynamic target up forward and De La searched deep at all costs. For the first fifteen, at any rate, the game seemed over with De La's mosquito fleet in full cry. Then a lull, and finally a Blues reply to pull it within two goals. But **Harrison** slotted his fifth to put out the lights.

**Michael Davidson** (DLS) and **Matt Torney** (UB) were perhaps best for their respective outfits, but it was a day when many players flashed in and out of the game. **Sam Pickett** and **Aaron Shields** were vital in the win. De La deserved it in the end, while the Varsity's effectiveness faded as the sun came out and the shadows lengthened.

### SEASON SKINNY:

It was again an extraordinary year in A Section. Few anticipated De La's resurrection, nor the relative ease with which Xavs cut a swathe through the competition. Last year's grand finalists St Bede's Mentone Tigers and Collegians slipped to fourth and

fifth, while predicted bolters Old Ivanhoe crashed and burned. Promotees Marcellin and Old Essendon came, saw and didn't conquer, though the former survives for another crack. Old Brighton and Old Scotch, pre-season favourites on the back of summer recruiting hauls, suffered huge casualties and didn't really fire a shot. Uni Blues began slowly, got themselves to the mid-table and then into the four and stayed there, falling short at the penultimate hurdle.

For the first time, we had two players from the one club tie for the Woodrow Medal. **Matt Fieldsend** and **David Lowe** from De La Salle shared the honour. **Matt Handley**, the Xavs' big blond bombshell, rebounded from an injury-ridden '08 to top the goals list from CHF. His teammate **Nick Wynne** enjoyed a stellar season in Xavs' back half and won the Rising Star. It must be said that none of these would have performed as well if not for the magnificent work of their teammates and the well-designed team structures in which they played.

We had three umpires, we had a semi-final that went to overtime and another that was a massive blowout. And all season long, week after week, we witnessed young men dedicated to their task, performing outstanding athletic feats that did our game and our competition proud. As one who loves watching Amateur football, I thank them all for their endeavours and congratulate them on their achievements.

**Coach:** Co-coaches see to be the trend, so I'll plump for **Simon Lethlean** (XAV) and **Dave Madigan** (DLS), though the fans are truly yearning for a return of the hot gosseller so we can hear them at the huddles. Where is **Alan Killigrews** when you need him?

### THE DECIDER:

Old Xaverians will start a short-priced favourite to take their eleventh A Section flag and their tenth in fifteen seasons, though a repeat of their last-start dominance appears unlikely. De La is too good a team to be put to the sword as it was a fortnight ago, and I'm expecting a contest more in the vein of that which we saw in Round 10.

If they roll the dice and Luck is a Lady today, then the silverware could be headed to East Malvern and a seventh A Section pennant destined for their clubhouse ceiling. However, there are factors that count against that occurring today.

Xavs have been the stronger team all year, albeit at times, not by a great margin. Xavs' two grand final losses over the past-decade-and-a-half – to Bernies in 2002 and Old Haileybury in 2006 - came at the hands of teams that were clearly superior to them. It might be argued too that they have also won Grand Finals in years where they haven't been the cream of crop, that is, until the Spring. Then there's the extra week's rest. Sometimes, this is no advantage at all, but if the game is tight as the light begins to fade, those fresher legs do make a difference. And what of injuries? We'll have to wait and see which players line up for the anthem, but the Red and Blacks look to have a full complement from which to choose, whereas De La might struggle to get a couple of its players to the line.

De La Salle is again on the rise, but today they'll pitch at base camp while the Xaverians go again to the summit. Don't expect the climb to be easy.

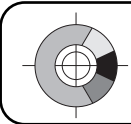

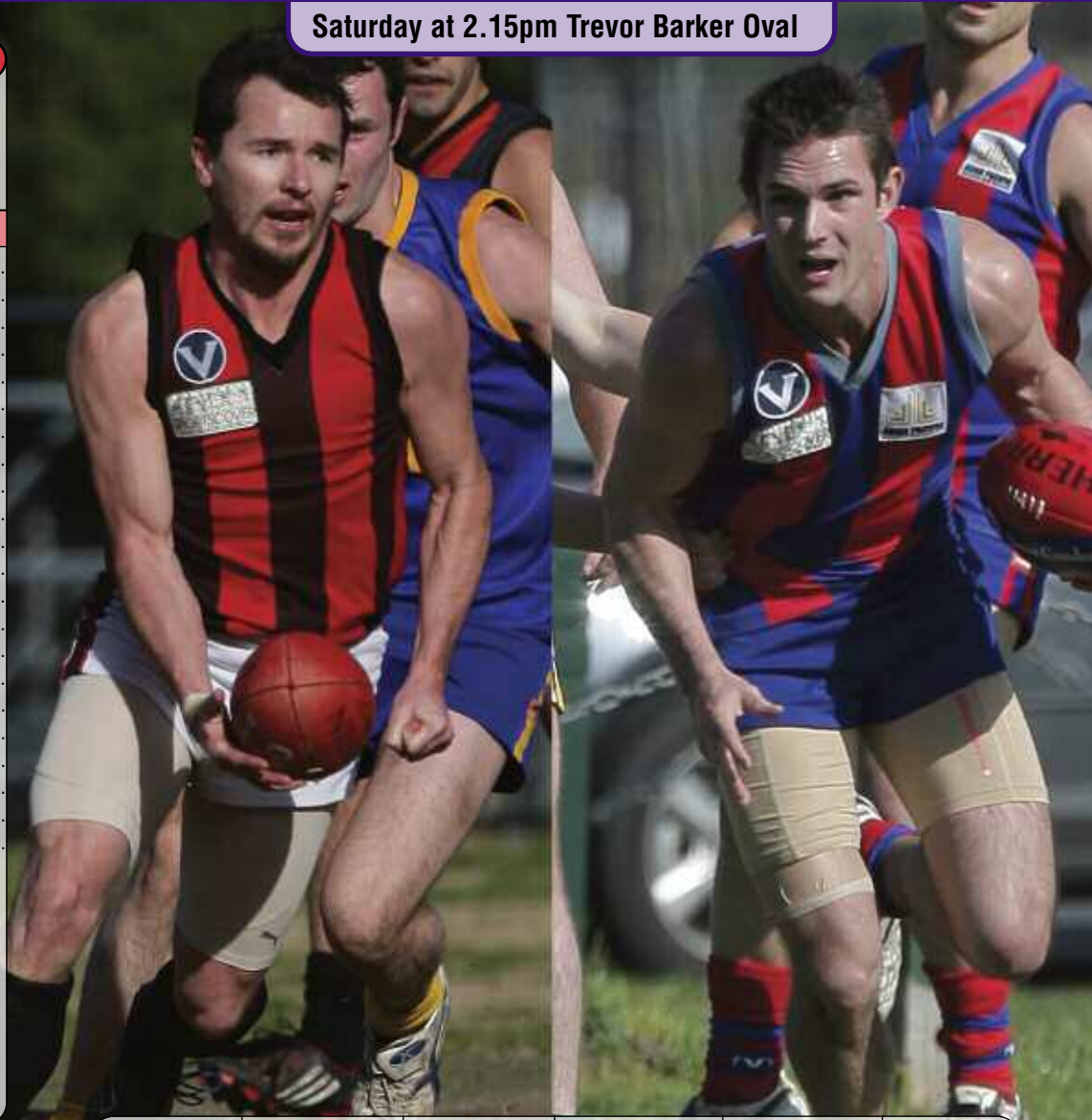

## 5 YEARS AGO – 2004

St Bernards reduced the Blues lead minutely in the third term before the Blues coasted to their third A Grade pennant, 18.13 to 7.13. ## 10 YEARS AGO – 1999

The VAFA Section Best and Fairest winners were A Section

## 20 YEARS AGO – 1989

After a blistering start in B Section with a quarter time advantage of 7.5, **AJAX** faced Marcellin's fight back but retained a 7 point lead at half time. **AJAX** forged ahead again in the third term and held on to win 13.14 to 11.20. Best players – **Kalmus (3), Bromberg, Schulberg, Zemski, M Ritterman, H Ritterman (AJAX) and P Gartner, Butler, P Dillon, Dennig, Aloisio, Cooper (Marcellin)**.

## 40 YEARS AGO – 1969

In the A Section Grand final, **Ormond** gained an early advantage with a five goal to three lead at quarter time. It became a torrid affair, not totally devoid of incidents, and **Coburg** had taken the lead by 5 points at half time. Ormond took advantage of the breeze again in the third term to set up a solid buffer going into the last quarter but Coburg were determined in their quest for their first A Section flag and stepped up in the last term to win the LA Adamson Cup 13.17 to 12.12.

In B Section, it was a very close checking and tight game throughout between **Ivanhoe** and **De La Salle**. De La were ahead by a solitary point at half time, relinquished the lead in the third term and could not make up the difference with Ivanhoe victorious 13.15 to 10.12.

**Norm Beattie of Coburg** won the **J N Woodrow Trophy** for the Fairest and Best player in A Section. **D J Mullin (Kew) and T Brown (Old Geelong Grammarians)** won the trophies in B and C Section respectively.

## 50 YEARS AGO – 1959

For the second successive season, **Old Scotch** and **Collegians** fought out the A Section Grand Final at Olympic Park (the third Grand Final running at Olympic Park). 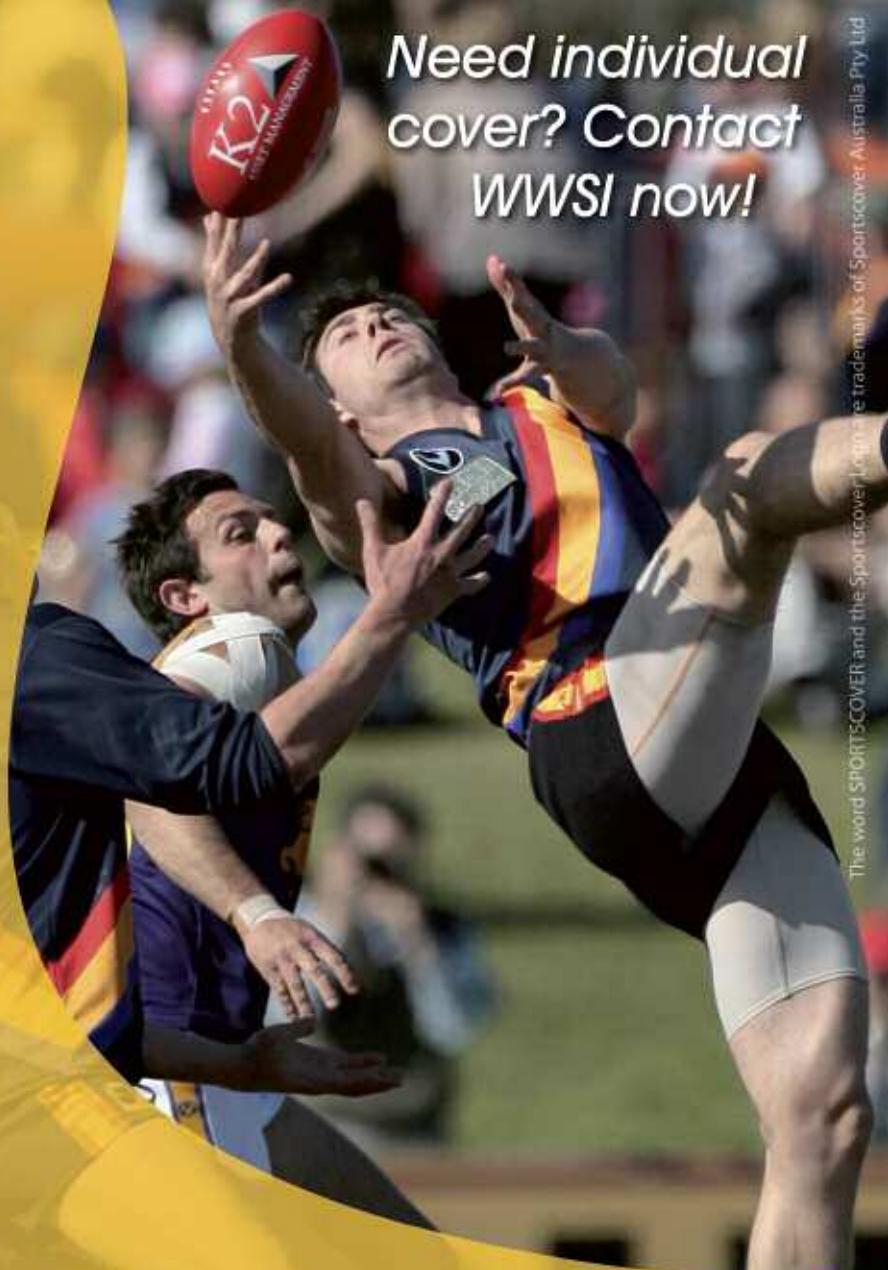
